#### A New Funding Plan Proposed

A Message From Superintendent Lisa Carmichael

VER THE PAST FIFTEEN MONTHS, A WORKGROUP OF SUPERINTENDENTS AND TREASURERS, THOSE WHO KNOW school funding best, was convened by Representative Bob Cupp (R-Lima) and Representative John Patterson (D-Jefferson). Although this group of dedicated educators are from differing types of school districts (i.e., rural, urban, suburban, and in between), they shared a common goal: they are committed to helping create a modern, comprehensive, and fair plan for all of Ohio's school children. The end resulted in the creation of the Ohio Fair School Funding Plan, a comprehensive and transparent school-funding plan for Ohio, developed collaboratively by educators and leaders in every corner of the state. The new Fair School Funding Plan bases state school-funding on what students truly need to succeed, as determined by local educators and researchbased studies.

As you know, the State has underfunded us for a number of years. It is widely recognized that our current school-funding formula, forged in the last recession, is seriously flawed. Under the current formula, Ontario has been capped. This means that our district should be receiving an additional \$2.6 million annually; however, the state has capped the amount of money to Ontario, and we have not received any of those monies owed to us. The proposed Ohio Fair School Funding Plan will eliminate most of these caps over a four (4) year period.

The proposed Fair School Funding Plan would be INCREDIBLE NEWS for our schools! In Richland County, Ontario Schools would see the largest increase from the State under the new proposed Fair School Funding Plan. If the plan were to pass, in its current form, we will see an increase of \$1.6 million in Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 and an ADDITIONAL \$1.4 million increase in FY 2021, for a total increase of over \$4.6 million (\$1.6 million year one, \$3 million year two) over the next two years from the state of Ohio.

The Fair School Funding Plan will ensure that Ontario's students will have the quality educational opportunities they all deserve.

The reason for the larger increase for Ontario is due to the loss of tangible personal property taxes and General Motors that our district has experienced. The State formula would have automatically replaced the lost funds, but the formula was suspended and the monies were never given to the Ontario District. The proposed Fair School Funding Plan will compensate for those losses.

Together, we can adopt a fair plan that meets the needs of Ohio's children and secures the future of our great state. If passed, the Fair School Funding Plan will ensure that Ontario's students will have the quality educational opportunities they all deserve. Most importantly, if passed in its current form, the Fair School Funding Plan will eliminate our district's impending need to pass a new levy in calendar year 2020 or 2021.
